The decement constitutes a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Ashwattha. Advisors: Private 1 mixed (AAPL) and Dr. Ambedkar College of Commerce and Economics, Wadala,

Kadman Advanta Advisors Private Limited (AAPL), which is a wholly-owned subsidiary of TechnoServe line is Assets of "Campus to Corporate Careers (C2C) Program" for enhancement of employability and workplace skills for descring youth.

- In this connection, AAPL intends to be associated and work closely with Dr. Ambedkar College of Commerce and Economics, Wadala to conduct employability training and career counseling sessions for the final year college students. This will include activities through the year, till students are placed 10-12 months after their final year examinations. Features of the program are as follows:
- 2. 80 hour program including Personal effectiveness (goal setting, interpersonal relationships), Personal Figure, Professional effectiveness (how to choose right career option, how to apply for job, tools-CVs, cover letters etc.), Business communication (effective communication with co-workers and customers). Career Readiness (orienting students to jobs matching their skill sets and exposure to a career path) and Work Readiness (Professionalism, Work Ethics, Email Etiquettes, Workplace dynamics - etc.)
- 3. 80 hours of training will be delivered in class and few hours of additional training will be available to students on TechnoServe's proprietary online learning platform. The program also includes individual student counselling during the program, post training, pre-placement and also post placements.
- 4. There is no cost for students to attend the above mentioned training.
- 5. Each training batch size will be a maximum of 50 students. Sessions of duration 2 hours each to be conducted 5 days per week. Trainings to be conducted for 2 or more batches in one day through one
- 6. Counselling support is available on training days for providing career guidance to students who are enrolled in this program.
- 7. Students will be provided a certificate on successful completion of course with minimum attendance
- 8. Students will be further supported in job linkages and placements from the time of training completion till they are placed i.e. 6-10 months after their training is complete.
- 9. College is expected to support the successful training and placements of all students, should they take up this service with TechnoServe.

For this purpose, AAPL requires support of the college in the following areas:

- 1. Facilitating discussions and engagement with the 2019 current third year degree students and 2018 graduates wherever feasible. This involves the following:
 - a. Assistance in batch scheduling with ongoing final year classes.
 - b. Support in allocating batches (of 45-50 students approximately) per trainer for optimum utilization of resources and training effectiveness.
- Infrastructure support for the following:
- a. Training facility (a training room where 50 students could be trained). Training methodology requires some space in the middle of the room for conducting student activities.
 - Space for the career counsellor/ trainer who would be available in college on days of training







- c. Availability of classroom to conduct refresher sessions as and when required.
- d. Projector and speakers on need basis which are required to conduct few video based sessions.
- e. Require college support to conduct a Parent engagement session in the college premises.
- f. Provide 100-200 students for training whom TechnoServe will screen.

Dipose a request by AAPL for this support, Dr. Ambedkar College of Commerce and Economics, Wadala has agreed to support and provide the appropriate assistance to AAPL, as mentioned below.

Based on the above, this MOU lays out immediate next steps to be taken by both parties.

AAPL agrees to .

- 1. Conduct Orientation sessions to make students are aware about the program and register their interest.
- Engage with students and form batches based on selection criteria for conducting the training program.
- Conduct the Campus to Corporate Careers Program in College premises.
- 4. Provide career counselling support to students enrolled in this program.
- 5. Facilitate further linkages with vocational training partners and employers for interested students.
- Bi-weekly placement reports and monthly placement reports of students linked to job opportunities
 will be provided to the college once placement activities commence.
- Helpline facility will be provided to the students to address their queries during training, post training and post placement.

Dr. Ambedkar College of Commerce and Economics, Wadala agrees to -

- Make classroom(s) available to train students in batches of 45-50, which should be ideal to cover 2
 batches per day. If more students express interest for this period, we may create another batch after
 this batch. The classroom should be equipped with board and AV system when required.
- Make table space available for career counseling.
- Providing one contact point who could be approached for any support (student engagement) related to this program.
- This MOU is neither a contract, nor is it legally binding in any way, nor does it commit any financial
 expenditure from or for either party.

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

<u>Dr. Ambedkar College of Commerce & Economics</u> Vision is "To become a premier Institution in providing higher education in the general and commerce education in particular, to deprived students in the city of Mumbai". <u>Antarang Foundation</u> envisions a world in which every young person is passionately, productively, and positively engaged in a career of their choice. It works with underprivileged youth in the age group 16-25 years by conducting employability skills programs thereby managing the transition from education to employability.

The parties have had preliminary discussions in this matter and have ascertained areas of broad consensus. The parties now, therefore, agreed to enter in writing these areas of consensus, under a Memorandum of Understanding.



- 2. GTT Foundation is engaged in the field of education & employability domain that provides training to the students as part of their CSR activity
- 3. Dr.Ambedkar College Of Commerce is willing to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with GTTF for the skills enhancement training program through the technology platform or other face to face initiatives.

NOW IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO AS UNDER:

1. Objective:

The objective of this MOU is to enable students of College access to resources that would enhance their employability

2. Period of MOU.

This MOU shall come into force and effect from the date of execution and shall remain valid for a period of Two years from such date after which the same may be reviewed by either party. However, if the same is not renewed this arrangement will be deemed terminated on the expiry of the said duration period.

3. Roles & Responsibilities of the College:

- a. College shall be responsible to nominate one person with adequate accountability and responsibility to coordinate the engagement. The person so appointed would act as the single point of contact (SPOC) for the proposed initiative.
- b. College shall share in their letterhead the details of the students who will attend the aforesaid training program with GTTF like name, email ID, contact details, Name of the Company in which Candidate is placed(current Company), qualification (along with the year of completion/pursuing) and other documents as per GTTF training requirements.
- c It would be the responsibility of College to ensure that proper publicity of the Program is made through College website.
- d. To encourage the Students to register for the Program by informing them about the benefits of the program.

6. Commercials

7. Certification

Certificates shall be awarded by GTTF to the students on successful completion of the training and clearing of the assessment held post completion of the training program.

8. Limitations and Warranties:

Both parties agree that it would be their endeavor to prevent any liability arising out of default or non-compliance of the MOU terms by the other party

9. Termination:







- a. Both parties can terminate the MOU with a prior written thirty (30) day notice on default of terms or non-agherence to any condition or responsibilities by the other party as outlined in this MOU in case such default is not rectified within such 30 days.
- b. Both parties also agree that it would be their professional endeavour that despite any termination of the MOU, progress would continue, without any prejudice to the ongoing Training Programs, which would be without any hindrance and would be progressed for completion.

10. Entirety & Amendment:

This MOU contains the entire understanding between the Parties in relation to the Training Program. If during the operation of the MOU, circumstances may rise which call for alteration / modification to this MOU, such alteration / modification shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing. Such changes will be formalized in writing as an 'Addendum' to this MOU. Any changes/amendments to this MOU not in conformance to this section shall be deemed to be void-ab-initio.

11. Intellectual Proprietary Rights:

Upon termination of this MOU and upon written request, the Party in receipt of the requesting Party's intellectual or proprietary property and/or information pursuant to this MOU shall return such information to the requesting Party.

12. Confidential Information

- a. Both parties undertake to each other to keep confidential all information (written or oral) concerning the business and affairs of the other, which has been obtained or received during the course(s) of performance hereunder, save that which is inconsequential or obvious;
- b. Already in its possession other than as a result of a breach of this clause; or in the hands of the public other than as a result of a breach of this clause.





c. In the event of any of the parties becoming legally comp information, such party shall give sufficient notice to th





- other party to seek a timely protective order or any other appropriate relief. If such an order or other relief cannot be obtained, the party being required to make such a disclosure shall make the disclosure of the Confidential Information only to the extent that is legally required of it and no further.
- d. College agrees not to deal directly or enter into any agreement any clients GTTF and should not share any information with them related to the training during the term of the agreement and also after the agreement have been terminated, not earlier than two years from the date of termination.


13. Force Majeure:

College agrees that during the term of this Agreement and for a period of two (2) years after the termination or expiry thereof, it shall not, directly or indirectly, employ, contract, solicit, hire or otherwise utilize the services of an existing employee of GTTF.





15. Jurisdiction and Arbitration:

- a. In the event of any dispute or difference between the Parties hereto, the courts in Fune alone shall have exclusive jurisdiction to try any matter arising between the Parties here. to and accordingly both the Parties shall submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of courts in Pune, Maharashtra.
- b. Any dispute arising out of, in relation to or in respect to this MOU shall be settled through mutual consultation and agreement, by the Parties to this MOU. In case a settlement is not arrived at within fifteen (15) days of reference, the dispute/s shall be referred to a sole arbitrator to be appointed in accordance to the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 as amended from time to time. The place of arbitration shall be Pune, India

This life skills enhancement training program is free of cost. GTTF shall not charge any fees on whatsoever account/name from the students or College for conducting the aforesaid training program.

7. Certification

Certificates shall be awarded by GTTF to the students on successful completion of the training and clearing of the assessment held post completion of the training program.

8. Limitations and Warranties:

Both parties agree that it would be their endeavor to prevent any liability arising out of default or non-compliance of the MOU terms by the other party

9. Termination:





- a. Both parties can terminate the MOU with a prior written thirty (30) day notice on default of terms or non-adherence to any condition or responsibilities by the other party as outlined in this MOU in case such default is not rectified within such 30 days.
- b. Both parties also agree that it would be their professional endeavour that despite any termination of the MOU, progress would continue, without any prejudice to the ongoing Training Programs, which would be without any hindrance and would be progressed for completion.

10. Entirety & Amendment:

This MOU contains the entire understanding between the Parties in relation to the Training Program. If during the operation of the MOU, circumstances may rise which call for alteration / modification to this MOU, such alteration / modification shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing. Such changes will be formalized in writing as an 'Addendum' to this MOU. Any changes/amendments to this MOU not in conformance to this section shall be deemed to be void-ab-initio.

11. Intellectual Proprietary Rights.

All intellectual or proprietary property and information, supplied or developed by either Party shall be and remain the sole and exclusive property of the Party who supplied or developed same. Upon termination of this MOU and upon written request, the Party in receipt of the requesting Party's intellectual or proprietary property and/or information pursuant to this MOU shall return such information to the requesting Party.

12. Confidential Information

- a. Both parties undertake to each other to keep confidential all information (written or oral) concerning the business and affairs of the other, which has been obtained or received during the course(s) of performance hereunder, save that which is inconsequential or obvious;
- b. Already in its possession other than as a result of a breach of this clause; or in the hands of the public other than as a result of a breach of this clause.









- c. In the event of any of the parties becoming legally compelled to disclose any confidential information, such party shall give sufficient notice to the other party so as to enable the other party to seek a timely protective order or any other appropriate relief. If such an order or other relief cannot be obtained, the party being required to make such a disclosure shall make the disclosure of the Confidential Information only to the extent that is legally required of it and no further.
- d. College agrees not to deal directly or enter into any agreement any clients GTTF and should not share any information with them related to the training during the term of the agreement and also after the agreement have been terminated, not earlier than two years from the date of termination.

13. Force Majeure:

Provided however, if either party claims that existence of any of the aforesaid conditions is delaying or disabling the performance by said party of its obligations under this MOU, such party shall give immediate notice to the other party of the existence of such conditions whose existence are claimed to delay or disable the performance of obligations as aforesaid.

14. Non-Solicitation:

College agrees that during the term of this Agreement and for a period of two (2) years after the termination or expiry thereof, it shall not, directly or indirectly, employ, contract, solicit, hire or otherwise utilize the services of an existing employee of GTTF.





15. Jurisdiction and Arbitration:



- The dates and timings of these awareness sessions will be mutually decided by the representatives of the two organizations.

Market Aligned Skills Training (MAST) Program

The Market Aligned Skills Training (MAST) is AIF's livelihood program which works to address the systemic imbalance by providing unemployed young people with a comprehensive skills training that equips them with the knowledge and skills needed to secure employment and succeed on the job.

AIF MAST program has covered different geographical conditions with different markets across 23 states in India cumulatively operating through 221 centers through partnership and direct implementation encompassing around 50 trades as per the need of particular location.
